The Parents in Recovery – Parents Recovery Coach would provide addiction recovery peer support, specialized recovery coaching, facilitate support groups within community partner organizations, and provide education for treatment and other resources exclusively to Family Treatment Court participants. This is a part-time, 20 hours a week, position. They will report directly to the Parents in Recovery Program Coordinator and work within the program's grant requirements and agreements. The ideal candidate identifies as a parent in recovery from substance use disorder for at least 3-years and is a compassionate, caring individual who works well within a team atmosphere. The position's wage range is (\$19-\$21) and is eligible for part-time equivalent employee benefits package. The Center is an EOE and encourages individuals in long-term recovery to apply.

Main responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Provide peer support and recovery coaching to Family Treatment Court participants;
- Facilitate parenting/SUD support groups;
- Maintain participant records and complete necessary reporting requirements;
- Work jointly with the Parents in Recovery Program Coordinator on program development, outreach, and representation;
- Continue all necessary training and certification requirements for the duration of the role with intent to enhance the program's effectiveness;
- Regularly attend pre-court staff meetings including I) Staffing and II) Services and Support Meeting.
- Other duties assigned.

Requirements for the position include:

- Knowledge and understanding of the recovery community needs
- Active in long-term recovery for a minimum of 3-years
- Must be a parent
- Proficient in Microsoft Applications and use of technology
- Current Vermont Recovery Coaching certification (IC&RC preferred)
- Flexible schedule
- Must be able to access Dept. of Corrections Facilities and must be able to work with a vulnerable population.
