Our Story

Our story, like any recovery story, is filled with transformation.

We started as an Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) clubhouse in Colchester in 2003. We then moved to a garage on Champlain Street in Burlington, where we officially became The Turning Point Center of Chittenden County in 2005.

Finally, in 2018, after two more moves and a successful capital campaign, we purchased the property at 179 South Winooski Ave, Burlington, VT. This milestone continues to act as a beautiful example of the strength of our community.

Today, our center continues to grow and expand. In 2025, we added three new programs and expanded our staff to meet the growing needs of our community.

We believe that our transformation will never stop, because the journey to recovery is unique for every individual. We hope to be able to support that journey in as many ways as we can.





The Turning Point Center of Chittenden County (TPCCC) is dedicated to providing accessible, free recovery services to individuals and families across Chittenden County. With flexible in-person, phone, and video options, we ensure that no one faces barriers to support. Open 365 days a year, our doors are always open to those in need.



“I have seen my participants start from early days in recovery evolve into leaders in their community, take on challenging career paths, and navigate many barriers of life.”



Our Impact


24,899 total in-person visits to our center in 2025.

A 189% increase in visits since 2022 tells a clear story: more people are reaching out, showing up, and choosing recovery together.

67% of participants reported moderate to strong agreement that they now have goals and great hopes for their future.





This representation reflects only individuals engaged in TPCCC programming; demographic data is not collected in low-barrier contexts in order to preserve accessibility.




